All participants MUST:

1. Be at TRAC by 7:30 AM for departure at 8:00 AM. (Return is approx. 1:00 PM)

2. Be a U.S. Citizen and at least 18 years of age.

3. Have the required forms of identification at the time of the tour in order to receive a Hanford visitor badge. See <u>Required Forms of Identification for Hanford Site Access</u> for important badging information. **Note: Federal ID requirements mandate such that some state IDs, including** <u>Washington's</u>, may require a second form of ID. *Please read information carefully.* Name provided on the bus tour registration must match exactly the name(s) shown on photo ID. 4. Bring a sack lunch. No lunch is provided. Water and snacks will be provided.

PLEASE NOTE: CAMERAS, CELL PHONES OR OTHER RECORDING DEVICES ARE PROHIBITED AND ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE TOUR BUS.

Registered and paid Symposium attendees are invited to attend a Hanford Site Bus Tour the day before the event. Tour is approximately 5 hours long. Tour departs/returns to the TRAC facility. Tour agenda available on separate flyer. Only 40 seats are available and are issued on a first come, first served basis.



The bus is scheduled to leave at 8:00 a.m. **Please arrive 30 minutes early** to ensure enough time for visitor badging. This tour is approximately 5 hours in duration. Restrooms will be available on the bus.

Please note: Substantial footwear and attire appropriate for an industrial site is required.

- Footwear that fully encloses the foot, made of leather or sturdy material, with non-slip sole (e.g., gripping traction-pattern tread) and a defined heel no higher than 2 inches. Open-toed and open-back shoes, high-heel shoes, sandals, ballet shoes, boat shoes or slip-on shoes are prohibited.
- Long pants and shirts with at least 4-inch sleeves required.

<u>TOUR AGENDA</u> Depart TRAC via Bus

All tour participants will board the tour bus at the TRAC. The tour includes briefings on several Hanford facilities supporting today's cleanup mission:

- Hanford's Cold Test Facility, a scaled version of one of Hanford's 177 underground nuclear waste storage tanks.
- Hanford's Plutonium Finishing Plant (PFP), which operated from 1949 to 1989, and represented the final step in the plutonium production effort at Hanford. Workers are now undertaking the monumental challenge of safely and compliantly preparing and demolishing the building.
- The Environmental Restoration Disposal Facility, a regulated and lined landfill with a current capacity of 18-million-tons, where Hanford's low-level radioactive, hazardous, and mixed waste are disposed.
- The 200 West Groundwater Treatment System, which combines several technologies to remove nitrates and metals, as well as radioactive and organic contaminants, before returning treated water to the ground via a network of wells.
- The Waste Treatment Plant, when completed will be the world's largest facility for turning millions of gallons of liquid radioactive waste into a stable glass form suitable for safe, permanent disposal.

The tour route will also pass by:

- Hanford's 300 Area where uranium was fabricated into fuel rods.
- Former nuclear reactors located along the Columbia River where the fuel rods were irradiated to produce plutonium for nuclear weapons.
